Lefebvre et Fils gallery is pleased to present, in collaboration with Aurélien Gendras, the ceramics of the French artist Jean-Pierre Viot from the 1970s.

### Jean-Pierre Viot by Robert Deblander

Discreet, friendly, attentive, Jean-Pierre Viot is a central figure in French ceramics. [...] Jean-Pierre Viot's research can be summed up in two words: rigor in the construction but sensitivity in the form and the material. While the first term lends itself to the obviousness of abstraction, the second is supposed to turn its back on them. Old debate, apparent contradiction, eternal fight between the classics and the romantics, the latter convinced that rigor engenders a purer emotion, the former convinced that Dionysian intoxication, or the simple Zen respect of nature have a more authentic song.

Jean-Pierre Viot strives to resolve this opposition, to propose a synthesis and shows us, if not demonstrates, that it is possible. I imagine that the work, the discovery of the earth, that of the potter who will undergo so many metamorphoses from the living walls of the quarry's excavations to the certainties of the essential pottery turned and set by the fire, may have guided his approach.

In his very first works he was confronted with architecture and this choice was to bring him the hypersensitivity of clay as if left to itself. His walls, his fountains, his sculptures would have seemed, if the technique had allowed it, to come straight out of the ground just eroded by the rains and the suns. But, under this gesture, the construction, as natural as it seemed, was present.

[...] Jean-Pierre Viot is lucid and only a great mastery can justify such an ambition. He plays this subtle game of the constructed deconstructed suggesting, his works try hard to elude the brutal referents. [...] We find ourselves in front of objects that have somehow returned to nature and that, beyond their solidity, their construction, their architecture, will al- low the viewer to formulate a personal response, to participate in the proposed dialogue.

Jean-Pierre Viot, who is as comfortable in small as in large sizes, knows how to embellish them with graphics, signs, scratches, and sudden thicknesses of enamel that emphasize their underlying organic character. As Haguiko points out, beyond the object itself, he works on a subject that is none other than the space generated by it, a bit like the musician is aware of the volume where the fluid sounds to which he has given birth and form will flow. [...] The work of Jean-Pierre Viot evokes a conquered serenity.

## JEAN-PIERRE VIOT 1968 - 1979 April 28 - May 28, 2022

Jean-Pierre Viot was born in 1936 in Rouen (76). He graduated in 1956 from the School of Fine Arts in Rouen. He participated in the creation workshop of the earthenware factory in Gien (45) between 1957 and 1958. He taught ceramics at the École Supérieure des Métiers d'Art in Arras (62) from 2006 to 2011. He is a member founder of the Contemporary Art Center of Chateauroux (CRAC) of the association Art Objet, Paris and he was also part of the organizing committee of the symposium of La Borne in 1977.

Jean-Pierre Viot is a member of the International Academy of Ceramics (AIC). He was a member of the Society of Decorative Artists (SAD) from 1975 to 1983 and of the National Union of Plastic Artists in Mural Art and Models (SNPCAMM) from 1975 to 1984. He also sat on the board of directors of the International of the new visual object (INOV) from 1986 to 1988 and was a very active member of the organization of the ceramics days, place Saint-Sulpice in Paris from 2006 to 2015.
